What Do They See?

Just recently I went to a service station to purchase some gas and I decided to go inside the store because I was thirsty and I wanted a cold bottle of water. When I went to the register to pay for my items, I had to wait in line for the cashier to serve the customer that was in front of me. This young man had three beers and the cashier (being that she was new on the job), did not know the price; however, since her supervisor was standing next to her at the register, she told her. The employee then asked her supervisor how she knew what the beer would cost without looking at the price listings? The supervisor said <u>" My mom is an alcoholic and she purchases beers here all the time."</u> My brothers and sisters, she did not say this in a joking manner! The supervisor went on to tell the employee that she purchases her alcoholic beverages from another store.

The bible tells us in Proverbs 22:6 NASB that we should "(6) Train up a child in the way he should go, even when he is old he will not depart from it."

We as Christians are called to be the standard, the ruler or if you will "the measuring rod." You may be the father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, brother, sister, aunt, uncle, god father, god mother or some other kind of role model in a young person's life.
