Trusting Him In Everything

One day on my way to work, I was driving beside another car and we both were approaching a stop light. I looked over and notice the rims spinning on her car, as I begin to slow down to stop at the light. She did not slow down until moments after me. It appeared to me that she stopped at the last moment! The fact is, she came to a total halt before the light because she had trust in the brake system on her car that it would do the job it was designed to do. In other words she trusted her brakes.

Wouldn't it be awesome if we displayed the same trust in Christ in all affairs? Many of us trust Him only in certain situations and most of them are when we are in trouble.

PROVERBS 3:5-6 NKJV – (5) Trust in the LORD with **all** your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; (6) In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths.

How many times have we heard or read the above passage. In verse (5) Christ is calling us to trust Him in everything and don't try to rationalize His works. For when we trust in Him totally, by yielding to Him, verse (6) is tells us that it is He who is directing our way of life.

So is it correct to say, we really trust God, though not in everything? Or will we say that favorite line, "**He knows my heart.**"

What is keeping us from trusting God completely? (1) Some areas of our lives, we never trusted Him before therefore; we should give Him that opportunity and I assure you positive results! How do I know this? The same way we believe He will take care of everything else. "**TRUST.**"
