Is He/She Your Blessing? (Pt. 2)


My single brothers and sisters, know that there are those who chose to be in a relationship and those who chose not. There are two ways to be in a relationship with the opposite sex leading up to marriage. God's way and our way. If it is according to the teachings of God, you will experience your blessing. If it is not according to God's teachings you will experience extreme negative consequences! Men and women have been discovering the negative consequences since man came into existence, but still insist on becoming mates with someone they believe is their blessing and possibly is not. Today lets review two examples of this.

Note: Proverbs 18:22 NASB – (22) He who finds a wife finds a good thing and obtains favor from the Lord.

Now, I ask that you open your bible to Judges 14:1-20. Read these scriptures as many times as necessary. Now let's do an observation. Notice Samson mentions in verse 2 that a woman caught his eye (lust) and instructed his father and mother to get her so that he could marry her. Verse 3 – His parents were God fearing and ask him why would he want such a woman? What was the big deal about a Philistine woman and Samson marrying one? Samson's desire for a Philistine wife clearly transgressed God's law (Deuteronomy 7:3-4), yet God used his disobedience for the good of His people. However, Samson himself never received a blessing for his rebellious choice and regretted it according to Judges 14:20. Notice in verse three Samson tells his father again "she looks good to me" (lust)! In verse 7, Samson is still in a trance (infatuation). In other words, she looks good, but she isn't any good. Verse 15 – Other men are threatening the Philistine woman and instead of her telling Samson the truth, she entices (dishonestly) him for the answer to the riddle from verse 16-17 and returns to tell the sons of her people. Verse 20 tells the consequences. Samson is in the "Hall of Faith", but imagine what God could have done through a wholeheartedly obedient Samson. Was this Philistine his blessing?

Now, I ask that you open your bible to 2 Samuel 11:2-27. Read these scriptures as many times as necessary. Now let's do an observation. David is <u>watching a woman and/or someone else's wife take a bath (lust)</u>. Verse 4 – David sends his messengers to inquire who this woman is and David eventually has her brought to his home and <u>sleeps</u> with her (adultery – Deuteronomy 5:18 and 21). Verse 5 – She is (impregnate). Verse 6-12 – David's <u>conspiracy</u> (dishonesty). David wanted her husband to sleep with her so it would look like she got pregnant by her him. Verses 14-22 – David's plan did not work, so he conspires to have the woman's husband <u>killed (murder)</u>. Verse 25 – David displays a (selfish) attitude. Verse 26 tells us that the woman mourned, but the question is, did she right have the right to sleep with David? Verse 27 – She <u>becomes David's wife (evil motives</u>). The bible also tells us in <u>verse 27</u> that God was very displeased! In 2 Samuel 12:1-9, Nathan the prophet (God's representative) confronts David about his wrong doings. Verses 10-14 tells us the consequences.

There are other stories in the bible that tells us what happens when we attempt to put a relationship together without the Lords approval.
