## **An Ordered Life**

**PROVERBS 29:16-27 NKJV – (16)** When the wicked are multiplied, transgression increases; But the righteous will see their fall. (17) Correct your son, and he will give you rest; Yes, he will give delight to your soul. (18) Where *there is* no revelation, the people cast off restraint; But happy *is* he who keeps the law. (19) A servant will not be corrected by mere words; For though he understands, he will not respond. (20) Do you see a man hasty in his words? *There is* more hope for a fool than for him. (21) He who pampers his servant from childhood will have him as a son in the end. (22) An angry man stirs up strife, and a furious man abounds in transgression. (23) A man's pride will bring him low, but the humble in spirit will retain honor. (24) Whoever is a partner with a thief hates his own life; He swears to tell the truth, but reveals nothing. (25) The fear of man brings a snare, but whoever trusts in the LORD shall be safe. (26) Many seek the ruler's favor, but justice for man *comes* from the LORD. (27) An unjust man *is* an abomination to the righteous, and *he who is* upright in the way *is* an abomination to the wicked.

She was gifted with a beautiful soprano voice and her joy overflowed as she praised Him.
