

The Perfect Praise

As I was growing in the faith in my earlier years of life, I would always look forward to going to church and to hear the choir sing. There were times the Spirit would be very high and times when the Spirit might not be at the same altitude. Unfortunately, it can be the same way at times in the church today. John gives us a description of the perfect praise that takes place in heaven. When I first read this passage, I said to myself "WOW", non-stop twenty-four hours a day of worship. We today definitely don't give honor like that! Then of course I would ask myself "why"? We have so much to be thankful for. Do we know who we are dealing with? This morning God has given me a small list of why He doesn't receive the praise He deserves today...

- 1. Disobedience Most people contradict God's word.
- 2. Fear of the Lord No respect at all.
- 3. Lifestyles We bring fleshly lifestyles into the church and expect to honor God with our best offering. We should always live a lifestyle of worship, so that the word of God will be in tact in the church as well as outside the church.
- 4. Thanksgiving Ungrateful
- 5. Strongholds Have not been delivered.

The list goes on and on. Chapter 4 of Revelation instructs us in worship. It shows us where, why and how to praise God. Worship takes our minds off problems and focuses them on God. Worship leads us from individual meditation to corporate worship. Worship causes us to consider and appreciate Gods' character. Worship lifts our perspective from the earthly to the heavenly.

We are not perfect people, but we should strive for that perfection of worship that only our heavenly Father deserves. It's called "A Perfect Praise".
